THE CANTERBURY AWARD**

The Canterbury Award has become well-established over the years with the aim of helping members develop both as educators and as enthusiastic members of the Society. It was the idea of Dorothy Haley after a financially successful state conference held at the University of Kent in Canterbury in 1984. Since then Members have undertaken diverse and interesting projects.

There are two avenues members might follow to be considered for the award. Either it will subsidise an **educational project** that you would like to pursue, or the money could go towards expenses for first time **travel** to an International DKG Conference.

Educational Project.

The Award committee would need to consider the aim and an outline of your project, and the programme you would anticipate following during the year. They would also hope that your work would be of benefit, not only to your own development, but also to those who would share the results of your scheme.

The Committee would ultimately require a report, which could be used either in the Newsletter or at a State Convention.

Travel Award.

During years when the Award is not granted to support a project the Canterbury Award becomes available to members of Delta Kappa Gamma who would appreciate the opportunity to attend a state, regional or international convention for the first time. Meeting a wider selection of members from different regions and countries, one realises the scope of the society, its full potential and its inspirational message to those in the field of education. Once again, a report to the Committee would be expected.

Your application should be endorsed by a professional colleague or a member of Delta Kappa Gamma.
